OLD BREWERY

Stunning 18th century sandstone building (an original working brewery, beautifully restored). Book the entire building or simply one room for a couple of hours – we offer flexible rentals at reasonable rates. Right beside the shoreline, many rooms have sea views and are cosy yet light.

- Sleeps 22 in a mix of singles, twins, triples and one double (cots can be added)
- Linen & towels provided
- Top floor Loft Studio – arranged for boardroom, theatre-style or horseshoe, plus relaxation
- Two ground floor studio / break-out rooms
- 2 x ground floor toilets
- Fully-equipped catering kitchen
- Café/dining room with French doors to patio and garden
- Conference facilities: 2 x projectors & screens; DVD player; whiteboards & flipcharts.
- Free parking
- BBQ
- Wifi
- Catering – choose to self-cater or have our team do it for you: everything from tea/coffee during a meeting to packed lunches to 2-course dinners. All dietary requirements catered for.
- Friendly, trained staff with hygiene and first aid certification

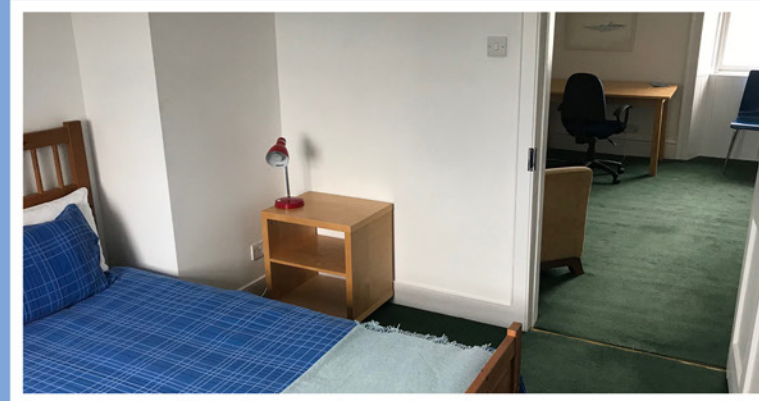

The magnificent, converted, Grade A listed Stable block halfway up the hill on the road to the South Sutor is our third property, also available to hire. Our seven artist studio bays and private one-bed flat form part of the building, but all remaining areas can be booked for everything from events, exhibitions and courses to conferences, weddings and filming/recording sessions.
